





CEC SUPPORT

CEC supports the proposal for a register of distributed energy resources (DER) – solar & storage

We support the plan for:

- AEMO to hold a register
- DNSPs to report DER to AEMO

But... the implementation plan might not work

It's OK... we can improve it



STICKS & CARROTS

AEMC proposes a compliance-based model, with reporting obligations on installers and DNSPs

Similar approach used in Qld with an estimated 30% reporting rate

Qld households are now paid \$50 to report on batteries that were not notified to DNSPs

Complement 'sticks and carrots' with mutually beneficial collaboration



BENEFITS OF COLLABORATION

AEMC has focused on compliance

Installers are obliged to report to DSNPs

DNSPs are obliged to report to AEMO

Need to build industry support, preferably without a need for \$50 reporting rebates

The Consumer Data Right is an ideal opportunity to build support for the AEMO register



REVIEW INTO OPEN BANKING

Treasurer will implement Consumer Data Right in banking, energy and telecoms

AEMO will hold consumer energy data & a DER register (& possibly tariff data)

AEMO to facilitate on-demand access to consumer electricity data to customers' authorized, accredited representatives

Obvious overlap between AEMO energy data register and DER register



BENEFITS OF ENERGY & DER TOGETHER

Retailers can verify reporting by installers

Retailers will need accreditation for third party data access to remain competitive

Data analysis to locate batteries (CSIRO) is cheaper than inspection

Monitoring DER will become easier & cheaper as control & communication systems improve



ROLE FOR DER RETAILERS

Don't focus everything on installers and DNSPs

DER retailers can play important role in reporting

DER retailers will need on-demand access to the AEMO register of consumer energy data to stay competitive

Use accreditation of DER retailers as another way to build industry support and improve reporting and compliance
