SUBJECT: ERC0270 Reporting of aggregate generation capacity for MT PASA

Macquarie Group Limited (**Macquarie**) welcomes the opportunity to provide this submission to the Australian Energy Market Commission's (**AEMC**) consultation on changes to the MT PASA.

Macquarie considers that it is important for the Australian Energy Market Operator (**AEMO**) to be able to prepare the MT PASA so that it is as effective and relevant for participants as possible.

Macquarie also considers that the MT PASA could be further improved by introducing greater transparency about the availability of individual generating units. We are supportive of refinement to the MT PASA process. Our detailed answers with respect to the rule change proposed in the AEMC Consultation Paper with reference ERC0270 are below.

Macquarie's participation in the Australian energy sector

Macquarie participates in the energy industry in various capacities as principal and in support of clients, including as: an electricity retailer to very large energy users such as industrial and manufacturing operations and market participant in the National Electricity Market (**NEM**); a financier for, and investor in, and developer of, renewable energy assets and infrastructure behind and in front of the meter; and a financial intermediary and provider of over-the-counter electricity derivatives products in the electricity contracts market as well as a major clearing broker for ASX electricity futures contracts.

Question 1: Assessment framework

Macquarie agrees that improving transparency and quality of information, cost minimisation, promoting reliability and providing regulator certainty should constitute the assessment framework when considering rule changes.

Question 2: Publication of aggregate generator availability data

Publication of aggregate generator availability data

- (a) Macquarie believes that providing generator availability at the aggregate level in the MT PASA does create issues. Macquarie is of the view that the exclusion of DUID availability in the MT PASA potentially leads to indirect and direct costs, reliability issues and less transparency. Further, Macquarie supports the MT PASA including published DUID availability as it may enable generators to more efficiently schedule outages in light of unit availability and that this may promote better reliability and lower costs going forward. In addition, Macquarie believes that the increased granularity promotes information transparency and will allow market participants to readily identify availability risks.
- (b) Macquarie supports the rule change requested by ERM Power that AEMO be required to include individual scheduled generating unit availability data (generator full and partial outage plans), not just aggregating generation availability for each region in the MTPASA outputs. Macquarie believes this rule change will lead to improved transparency for all market participants by removing information asymmetry and may potentially lead to lower direct and indirect prices for end consumers as generators are more effectively able to plan generator outages and assess potential market reliability impacts.

Question 8: MT PASA outlook

- (a) Macquarie believes the MT PASA duration of two years is insufficient.
- (b) Macquarie supports the rule change request to extend the duration of the MTPASA timeframe from two years to three years. Macquarie believes that the longer duration MTPASA would potentially allow participants better data to assess the supply-demand balance over the medium-term horizon, understand the closure profile of retiring generation units and promote better signals for new supply investment or demand management in the mediumterm timeframe.
