Consultation on the Panel's draft report on the Reliability and Emergency Reserve Trader (RERT) Guidelines

29 September 2016

The Reliability Panel (Panel) has commenced consultation on the Reliability and Emergency Reserve Trader (RERT) Guidelines in accordance with clause 8.8.3 of the National Electricity Rules (Rules).

The Panel has published the draft RERT Guidelines (in Appendix A of the draft report) for consultation and is seeking submissions on the amendments outlined in the draft report.

The Panel will hold a meeting to provide an opportunity for comments and questions on **Wednesday, 19 October 2016** in Sydney. All interested stakeholders are welcome to attend. Details of the meeting will be published closer to the date on the AEMC's website: www.aemc.gov.au.

The Panel invites comments from stakeholders on the draft RERT Guidelines outlined in the draft report. Submissions should be provided to the Panel no later than **Thursday, 10 November 2016**.
