I took issue with a statement made by ABC this week that said that 20% (one in five) Australians had solar power. My point was that 20% of homes/households does not equate to 20% of Australians. The major difference is the millions of people living in units/apartments. The ABC responded that their article was based on a statement from AEMC below. "For the 20% of customers with solar, there could be a range of export charge impacts, depending on system size. A 4–6kW system would still earn on average \$900 – about \$70 less than now".
